New CPD Law Takes Effect PRC Releases Implementing Rules and Regulations



Republic Act 10912 or the Continuing Professional Development Act of 2016, lapsed into law last July 21, 2016 and was implemented in January 2017. Said law mandates every registered professional under the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) to acquire specific number of CPD units in order to renew the professional identification cards.



Last January 7, the PRC Board of Med Tech conducted a consultative meeting with the different stakeholders to discuss the final version of the Operational Protocol. Among those who joined were representatives from the PAMET Board, PASMETH Board, Advisory Council, Regional Directors, Chief Medical Technologists, CHED Technical Committee for Med Tech Education, Diagnostic Industry, PAMET Institutional Review Board and PAMET Committee Chairs.

Likewise, the various CPD Councils were tasked to draft the Operational Protocols for their respective professions that will serve as guide in smooth and

Second, PAMET was invited on January 11, to be part of the task force to look into the Precarious Working Conditions of Healthcare Professionals, through former Cong. Leah Paquiz, who was deputized by the Department of Labor and Employment.

Third, the formation of Pool of Experts for the Specialty Group was initiated on January 13 and had the first organizational meeting at UST Botanical Garden on January 19.

Fourth, PAMET Board and Advisory Council met with the Board of Philippine Society of Pathologists (PSP) on January 24, wherein the proposed Med Tech Bill was

Fifth, the strategic planning was held on January 27-29, at Timberland Nature Resort to draw the direction of the organization for 2017-2018.

Sixth, PAMET became an official partner of Duterte Cabinet Spouses Association on January 30, in conducting the nationwide blood typing and blood donation program. This is in partnership with the Department of Health.

The months of February and March were highlighted by the formation of three new chapters namely North Cotabato, Aurora and Antique. Some chapters were reorganized such as Davao Del Norte and Capiz. Likewise, the month of March saw the successful staging of 14th South Luzon Regional Conference in Tagaytay on March 23-24, and the 8th Visayas Regional Conference in Boracay, Aklan on March 30-31.

It was also in February where monthly CPD activities started in NCR and complemented by several similar activities in different chapters nationwide.

The first quarter of the year may be over and several milestones and initiates have been accomplished, but the line-up of programs and activities for the year continue to pile up- all for the good of our members.

It only goes to show that PAMET is indeed on the right track.

efficient conduct of various CPD and other related activities. Said protocols will supplement the Implementing Rules and Regulations which was released on February 15, 2017 and took effect on March 15, through PRC Resolution 1032.

Among the salient points of the IRR and Operational Protocol are:

- Required CPD units
 With regards to the required CPD
 units during the first three years of
 implementation, the following were
 recommended by Med Tech CPD
 Council to the Commission:
 - 1. January-June 2017 no CPD units required
 - 2. July-December 2017 15 CPD units
 - 3. 2018 30 CPD units
 - 4. 2019 45 CPD units
- Distribution of CPD units in four areas of discipline
- Ways to earn CPD units

For Medical Technology, the Council is composed of Hon. Marilyn R. Atienza, member, PRC-Board of Med Tech; Mr. Ronaldo E. Puno, PAMET President; and Dean Bernard U. Ebuen, PASMETH President.

This is also in response to the mandate of the CPD Law that specifically requires the Professional Regulatory Boards and Accredited Professional Organizations to develop a career progression and specialization in each profession.

On March 12, 2017, a history was made when the specialty group was officially formed during the convergence meeting at Crowne Plaza Galleria, wherein the structure of the program was launched and the appointments were released, which in return were conformed by all members of the group.

There were twelve clusters formed covering all major areas of medical technology practice. Said clusters will work on the development of modules and criteria for PAMET members who will take the professional route to level up. The group will also develop CPD programs to be offered to all members of the association.



The highlight of the program was the presentation of Former Congresswoman Leah S. Paquiz, of Ang Nars Partylist. Ms. Paquiz discussed the government initiatives on the precarious working conditions

PAMET Works for Better Med Tech Working Conditions, Joins DOLE in Crafting Guidelines



Last January 11, 2017, some PAMET National Officers led by President Ronaldo E. Puno and committee chairs, took another brave step to address various issues affecting the Medical Technologists both in the private and government sectors.

The team from PAMET had an exploratory meeting with Party List Representative Dr. Leah Paquiz, who was deputized by the Department of Labor



and Employment (DOLE) to look into the current precarious working conditions of health professionals including Medical Technologists.

Among the issues and concerns tackled were matters concerning appropriate salary, hazard pay, job order, non-Med Techs allowed to do Med Tech work, professional encroachment, contractualization and underemployment. This is in response to the government's thrust of providing fair employment conditions to everyone.

Other PAMET Officers and committee chairs who joined Pres. Puno, were PRO Gamaliel A. Fulgueras, Director Myra Maceda and former Director Evangeline Castillo.

Moving forward, PAMET will conduct various fora and surveys in different regions to gather more data and evidences that will form part of the position paper that PAMET will submit to concerned government agencies.

Likewise, PAMET will eventually become part of the task force that will monitor the prevailing working conditions in different institutions employing Medical Technologists.

On March 7, 2017, PAMET was represented in ainteragency meeting called by the Bureau of Working Conditions under DOLE wherein the draft Guidelines Governing the Employment and Working Conditions of Healthcare Professionals was presented and discussed.




